

Introducing Arthramid

What is Arthramid

A 2.5% injectable polyacrylamide hydrogel, Arthramid is delivered directly into the affected joint(s) via intraarticular injection, performed under reversible sedation.

How does Arthramid Work?

By targeting the joint's synovial membrane (the structure that produces joint fluid), Arthramid acts to restore the health and function of this membrane.

This in turn leads to a reduction in inflammation, better joint health, and a decrease in clinical signs such as:

- Reduced stiffness
- Restored flexibility/range of motion improved joint fluid quality, which cushions, nourishes cartilage and reduces friction
- Enhanced stability in treated joints
- Slows progression of degenerative joint disease
- **When used as part of a comprehensive management plan, treatment results can last 12-18 months**

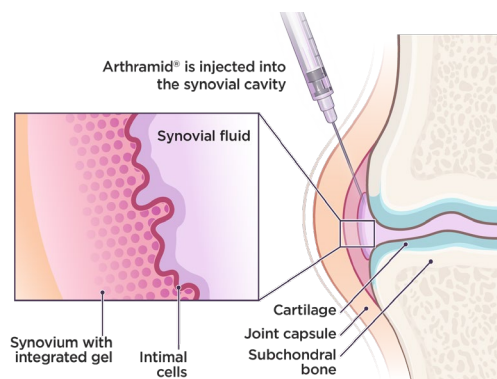


Indications

Arthramid is not indicated for use in joints where primary surgical treatment could reasonably be employed.

Indications include:

- Non-surgical management of severe degenerative joint disease
- Ancillary treatment post-op long term management



Post-Treatment Care

To help your dog get the most out of their treatment, follow these steps:

- Rest for 48 hours: keep activity minimal for the first two days
- Controlled exercise: stick to short, gentle leash walks for the next 2 to 4 weeks, slowly increasing duration as your vet permits
- Recheck exam: schedule a recheck exam at 4 to 6 weeks post treatment
- Continue rehab: if your dog has a rehab plan, keep following it as advised

Proven Results

- 85% of dogs show relief from the clinical signs of degenerative joint disease
- 63% of dogs reduce or discontinue the use of other pain medications improved mobility and range of motion in treated joints
- long-lasting benefits with increased freedom of movement and overall improvement in quality of life over time
